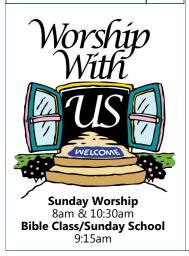

Prehypertension: Why It's a Warning Sign Not to Ignore

Prehypertension (PHTN) is blood pressure that is slightly higher than normal, but not considered to be hypertension (HTN). Blood pressure (BP) is the force of blood pushing through the artery walls. Medically, PHTN is not a disease and usually has no symptoms. Those with PHTN are at risk for developing HTN and heart problems. Blood pressure can be decreased by changes in lifestyle. HTN can damage organs and tissues. Blood pressure is measured by a reading of the Systolic number (top number) and the Diastolic number (bottom number). Systolic measures the force against the arteries while the heart beats, and Diastolic measures the force against the arteries while the heart is at rest. BP readings: Normal = <120/<80; PHTN = 120-129/<80; HTN Stage 1 = 130-139/80-89; HTN Stage 2 = 140>/90>.

Is PHTN Serious? PHTN is a path to develop HTN. It can be reversed through lifestyle changes. To know whether your BP is normal, you need to measure it at the doctors office, pharmacy, or at home. Regular monitoring is best. If normal, the American Heart Association recommends every two years. With PHTN or HTN checking should be done frequently, especially if you have a medical or family history of HTN.

PHTN can develop due to lack of physical activity, high salt intake, smoking and vaping, use of alcohol, lack of sleep.

Risk Factors = > 65 years old, obesity, Black or non-Hispanic, diabetic, and family history.

Treatment = increase physical activity, manage mental and emotional stress, decrease sodium, limit/avoid alcohol, quit smoking, lose weight, no medication required at this time unless you have a risk factor.

PHTN is warning signs for heart attack, heart failure, stroke, TIA (transient ischemia attacks), angina (chest pain).

Possible effects of HTN on the body = aneurysm, dementia, problems with memory/understanding, bleeding in the eye, sleep apnea, blurred or loss of vision, chest pain, arrhythmias, kidney failure, left ventricular hypertrophy, heart attack or stroke, artery damage, heart failure, hardening of the arteries, erectile dysfunction, blood clots, vaginal dryness or lowered sexual desire, osteoporosis.

Primary HTN vs. Secondary HTN = primary also known as essential HTN. There is no specific cause known. Secondary HTN there is an identifiable cause for HTN, i.e. narrowing of arteries, adrenal gland disease, side effects from medications (birth control pills, diet aids, stimulants, antidepressants, and some over the counter medications), obstructive sleep apnea, hormone abnormalities, thyroid abnormalities, and constriction of aorta.

HTN is known as the "silent killer." Usually there are no identifiable symptoms, and most have no cause. BP normally tends to increase with age. Monitor it frequently, change your lifestyle, eat healthy, quit smoking, and take your medications.

Statistics: 1 in 3 US adults (75 million) have HTN per the CDC; 65% of people 60-69 year have HTN; 54% have HTN under control; estimated cost in US is \$48.6 billion each year; and HTN is the major risk factor for heart disease, stroke, and kidney disease.

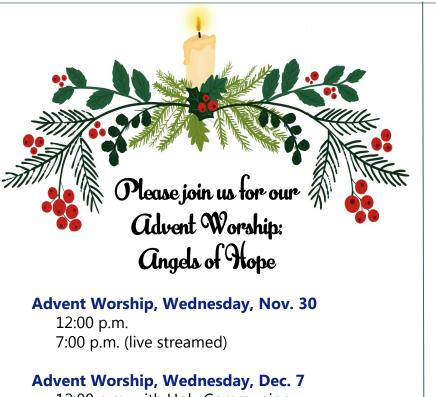
