
A Message From Our Senior Pastor

It's that time of year again when the cold and influenza (flu) season comes around. Many have already gotten their flu vaccine for the year. But many are still debating on getting the vaccine or taking a chance getting sick with the influenza virus. The flu shot is designed to help prevent an infection of the "flu" virus. This is an annual decision many strive to make. The influenza virus can cause serious illness (rarely fatal) especially in the high risk category of young children and older adults, and those who suffer from a chronic illness or health problems.

The vaccine works by causing the body to produce its own protection (antibodies) against the virus. The flu vaccine is the best method for preventing and decreasing the seriousness of the illness if one becomes infected. The brand of vaccine and the dosage depend of the age of the recipient. The flu vaccine is not recommended for infants less than 6 months old. As with any vaccine, it may not fully protect the person from infection.

There are different types of flu viruses that cause infections every season, usually causing the need to produce a new vaccine and given for each flu season. The vaccine does not contain the live influenza virus. Therefore, it cannot cause a person to get the flu from the vaccine itself. Be sure to read all the information available from your health care professional before receiving the flu vaccine. If you have questions or doubts, ask your health care professional or pharmacist for all the information that is available. The flu shot is given by injection into a muscle in the upper arm for adults, and for infants 6 months and older the injection is in the upper thigh area. Children receive the shot in the upper arm as well. One dose is the standard practice for adults, and children over 9 years old. Children under 9 years of age will sometimes receive 2 smaller doses. The time for the injection is usually September through November, when the cases begin to increase at the start of the flu season.

There are side effects to watch for as with any vaccine. They include: soreness, redness, swelling at the injection site, tenderness that may occur and last 1-2 days. Also watch for fever, muscle aches, headaches, or weakness. These may continue beyond 2 days. But if they do continue or become worse and bothersome, contact your health care professional right away. Some side effects have been reported but are rare: fainting, dizziness, vision changes, ringing in the ears. Tell your health care professional immediately. Sitting or lying down may help, as these may not last long. Some may also experience rare side effects of allergic reaction. If any of the following occur call your health care professional immediately or call 911. These symptoms are: rash, severe dizziness, itching, swelling of the face/throat/tongue, and problems breathing.

As a precaution to avoid potential problems, inform your health care provider if you have any allergies to the medication or preservatives in the vaccine. Also tell them if you have a history of seizures, a history of Guillain-Barre syndrome, Cancer, Leukemia, or are undergoing radiation treatment.

Be sure to tell your health care professional all of the medications (prescribed, over-the-counter, or herbs and supplements) that you are taking as it may interfere with the vaccine or with the medications you take.

Weighing the pros and cons of the influenza vaccine is a serious decision that should be made with caution and the help of your health care professional. Getting the influenza virus can lead to more serious illnesses if you are at risk for getting sick, so choose wisely.


NEW OFFERING ENVELOPES FOR 2024


