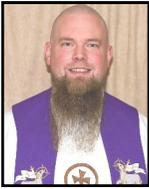

Jesus In The Psalms - Psalm 7 (ESV) A Shiggaion of David, which he sang to the Lord concerning the words of Cush, a Benjaminite.

¹O LORD my God, in you do I take refuge; save me from all my pursuers and deliver me, ²lest like a lion they tear my soul apart, rending it in pieces, with none to deliver. ³O LORD my God, if I have done this, if there is wrong in my hands, ⁴if I have repaid my friend with evil or plundered my enemy without cause, ⁵let the enemy pursue my soul and overtake it, and let him trample my life to the ground and lay my glory in the dust. Selah ⁶Arise, O LORD, in your anger; lift yourself up against the fury of my enemies; awake for me; you have appointed a judgment. ⁷Let the assembly of the peoples be gathered about you; over it return on high. ⁸The LORD judges the peoples; judge me, O LORD, according to my righteousness and according to the integrity that is in me. ⁹Oh, let the evil of the wicked come to an end, and may you establish the righteous— you who test the minds and hearts, O righteous God! ¹⁰My shield is with God, who saves the upright in heart. ¹¹God is a righteous judge, and a God who feels indignation every day. ¹²If a man does not repent, God will whet his sword; he has bent and readied his bow; ¹³he has prepared for him his deadly weapons, making his arrows fiery shafts. ¹⁴Behold, the wicked man conceives evil and is pregnant with mischief and gives birth to lies. ¹⁵He makes a pit, digging it out, and falls into the hole that he has made. ¹⁶His mischief returns upon his own head, and on his own skull his violence descends. ¹⁷I will give to the LORD the thanks due to his righteousness, and I will sing praise to the name of the LORD, the Most High.

During my recent trip to Hotel BSW Hillcrest I was treated to the finest of care, the choicest of foods, and entertainment options too numerous to count. Okay, so actually one of those is true, the other is halfway accurate, and the last is a bit of a stretch.

As thankful as I was for the many blessings God provided me during that time, if I could have changed one thing I would have wanted more to watch on television. My options were often quite slim. I did get to watch a rerun of a show that used to be a favorite in my house when I was growing up - Matlock.

The episode I watched bore many similarities to Psalm 7. Matlock is asked to defend an individual who claims to be innocent of the crime he has committed. There is a slight hitch at the beginning of the show, as Matlock is frustrated and upset with his potential client because of an unrelated business transaction with the client that has Matlock steaming with anger.

In Psalm 7, David is much like that client - he is falsely accused of a crime he did not commit. The only person he has to turn to is God. But, David knows full well that he cannot stand before his Holy and Righteous Lord as fully innocent. He might be falsely accused, but that does not mean he is without fault or sin.

How then does David approach God? We see in verse 12 it is in repentance. As Jesus says in Luke 13:5, "Unless you repent, you will perish, too" (NLT). God's Word is very clear concerning the weight of sin - it leads to death. There is nothing we can do to change that, save for coming to Him in repentance. It is from confession and repentance that we receive forgiveness and grace and the title of "Righteous One."

Matlock ends up representing the client, and of course, because it is Andy Griffith, he wins the court case and the client is released as a free man.

In Christ, God does the same for us. We will be falsely accused on account of Jesus' name. We will be falsely accused of things we have never done because of the weight of sin. Most importantly, we will be rightly brought to guilt and shame because of our own sinful actions. No matter the case, with repentant hearts we can confess with David, "I will give to the LORD the thanks due to his righteousness, and I will sing praise to the name of the LORD, the Most High" (Psalm 7:17).

A Christmas card was published several years ago that had a minister taking a nap in his study on Christmas morning. As he slept, he dreamed of what the world would have been like if Christ had not come. No Christmas bells would be playing the Christmas favorites... no happy voices singing, "Joy to the World, the Lord is come." In his dream, the pastor walked down the streets but here were no churches standing on the corners. When he returned to his study, he found no books about the Savior on his shelves. As he stood there puzzled, the doorbell rang. It was small boy asking him to come visit his dying mother. He quickly went with the little boy to his house, sat down on the bed beside his dying mother, and opened his Bible to read some words of comfort and hope. He turned quickly to two of his favorite passages, John 3:16 and John 14, but they weren't there; his Bible ended with the book of Malachi. There was no New Testament message of salvation, no word of the glorious resurrection, no promise of heaven. The pastor took the hand of the dying woman and wept bitterly for there was nothing he could say, Christ had not come.

Just then the minister was awakened by the voices of the church choir as they were getting ready for worship and they were singing, "O come, all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant; O come ye, O come

ye, to Bethlehem; Come and behold Him, born the king of Angels; O come let us adore Him, Christ the Lord." He listened quietly for a few minutes with a new and deeper appreciation for Christmas...how that good news filled him and thrilled him.

What a sad and tragic time it would be for us if Christ had not come...if there would be no Christmas and the birth of Jesus...no Easter and the glorious resurrection...no promise of eternal life for those loved ones who have gone before...no words of comfort and hope in the dark and dreary times of life.

This Christmas, make the time to think about this... how would life be for you if Jesus had not been born? How blessed you are that He was born and that you know Him as the Savior, Christ the Lord. Take the time with joyful hearts to thank and praise Him that, as the Apostle Paul wrote, "When the fullness of time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, to redeem them that were under the Law, that we might receive adoption as sons" (Galatians 4:4).

May the joy of the Savior's birth fill you this holiday season, and may you and yours have a most blessed and Christ-centered Christmas.
