Those "O" Favorite Hymns

When we get to the season of Advent and Christmas at the beginning of a new Church Year calendar, we get into the season of singing some of my favorite hymns. As a child, these hymns were some of the first ones learned in preparation for Christmas programs and continued to be those we would often sing as we went Christmas caroling. My guess is that many of you are the same way. You love to sing the Christmas carols. (This is one of the reasons why I include a Christmas in July service every year, so we can sing some Christmas hymns and not have to wait until December!)

With that love for Christmas hymns, our Wednesday Advent worship services this December will take a look at some favorite Advent and Christmas hymns. The theme for this series will be, "Those "O" Favorite Hymns." This is not a typo. It is not supposed to be "Old" or "Ol." This is because we will focus on hymns that begin with "O."

Namely, this Advent series will focus on the following special "O" hymns of the Christmas season: "O Come, O Come Emmanuel," "O Little Town of Bethlehem," and "O Come, All Ye Faithful." Each week we will review the writer and history, the Scriptural background and the Scriptural hope expressed in the words of the hymn. AND, of course, we will sing that special hymn.

The great thing about these favorite "O" hymns is the focus each gives to the coming of Christ as our Savior and Lord. With the focus of the season of Advent on Christ who came as the Incarnate Son of God, who comes to us today in Word and Sacrament, and who will come again on the last day, we focus our own lives on preparing to meet Him aright when He comes again.

I hope you can join in our special Wednesday Advent worship services, on December 4, 11, and 18; times are 12 noon or 6:30 p.m. "The Lord God is my strength and my song and has become my salvation" (Isaiah 12:1-2, ESV).

Jesus In The Psalms - Psalm 17 (ESV)

¹Hear a just cause, O Lord; attend to my cry! Give ear to my prayer from lips free of deceit! ²From your presence let my vindication come! Let your eyes behold the right! ³You have tried my heart, you have visited me by night, you have tested me, and you will find nothing; I have purposed that my mouth will not transgress. ⁴With regard to the works of man, by the word of your lips I have avoided the ways of the violent. ⁵My steps have held fast to your paths; my feet have not slipped. ⁶I call upon you, for you will answer me, O God; incline your ear to me; hear my words. ⁷Wondrously show your steadfast love, O Savior of those who seek refuge from their adversaries at your right hand. ⁸Keep me as the apple of your eye; hide me in the shadow of your wings, ⁹from the wicked who do me violence, my deadly enemies who surround me. ¹⁰They close their hearts to pity; with their mouths they speak arrogantly. ¹¹They have now surrounded our steps; they set their eyes to cast us to the ground. ¹²He is like a lion eager to tear, as a young lion lurking in ambush. ¹³Arise, O Lord! Confront him, subdue him! Deliver my soul from the wicked by your sword, ¹⁴from men by your hand, O Lord, from men of the world whose portion is in this life. You fill their womb with treasure; they are satisfied with children, and they leave their abundance to their infants. ¹⁵As for me, I shall behold your face in righteousness; when I awake, I shall be satisfied with your likeness.

He was going to be surrounded by people who didn't just dislike him - they hated him. He was going to be surrounded by peers who would be pointing fingers at him. He was going to be surrounded with the sound of jeers and taunts and accusations of the horrific things he had done. He was going to be surrounded by pious, acrimonious pillars of the community who sought to rid themselves of the individual who had popped the bubble of their perception of life and disrupted the visage of their perfect little world. He was going to be surrounded by those who would send him off to be physically torn apart and shredded to pieces.

Which "He" was this? It is the He of whom we are planning to celebrate the birth of once again. It is the He that we are going to see almost everywhere we go, from the manger scene in my front yard to the nativity set on your shelf to countless cards and memes on the internet as a little baby boy. The scriptures do not speak to how much Jesus knew about the exact plan of God the Father when He was in the womb, or as a baby, a toddler, a young boy, a teenager, or a young adult.

What we do know is that Jesus, who was and is and is to come THE WORD of God, knew that word and knew that the Messiah was going to suffer.

It is appropriate at this time of year to celebrate His birth and the beginning of His life here on Earth. But, in the midst of the joy and cheer of Christmas, it is good to remember that the child in the manger is the "He" who knew Psalm 17. He knew it was himself who ultimately was going to be surrounded by so much worse than a bunch of people who hated him - He was going to be surrounded by all the sin of mankind. And while surrounded by that sin on the cross, He was going to experience separation from God the Father.

He knew all that, and came to Earth anyway - and truly has to be the greatest gift of all time.

Joseph of Nazareth – Jesus' Earthly Father

It is hard to believe that it is Christmas time again. How fast the year flew by? For Christians, this time of year is always about the coming of the Messiah, the baby Jesus. But little is spoken of his earthly father, Joseph of Nazareth. The Scripture speaks of Joseph in the birth story of Jesus, a few times when the angel appears to him, when Jesus is lost in the Temple, and then, there is no more mentioned about this courageous man (Matt. 1:18-25; Matt. 2:13-15; Matt. 2:19-23; Luke 2:41-52). God the Father must have dearly loved Joseph and found him to be a righteous man to have entrusted the raising up of his only son.

Joseph was exposed to grave social stigma, must have felt heartbroken and betrayed by Mary. Yet, he had compassion on her and did not want to cause her any more humiliation. So, showing kindness and mercy, he was going to divorce her quietly until God intervened. He was a man of great integrity and self-discipline for he was to know her not until after the birth of Jesus. He showed his selflessness in his obedience to God's will whenever the need arose. He did what any good parent would do for a biological child, and cared for his physical needs, taught him the Scriptures until he was able to go to school, taught him the Jewish traditions, laws, and religious observances (i.e. Passover). He taught him the skills of carpentry, and the sense of responsibility to care for his family after Joseph died. He was a man of strong principles and convictions who lived out his beliefs in his actions.

Joseph's life was one of faith and obedience. He did God's will all the while doing his part to fulfill the prophecy. No doubt, even though God the Father had Jesus' stay here on earth a preordained plan, Joseph played a large part in preparing Jesus for his ministry. What a wonderful man and parent Joseph of Nazareth was to Jesus. He was and is a wonderful role model and example to any parent to emulate.

Sharon Beth Brani, the author of the article Joseph: Adoptive Faithful Father of Jesus Christ put it this way, "While we only get a few glimpses of him, scripture reveals to us that Joseph was faithful to God. Could it be that this is the key to successful parenting? To model a life of consistent faithfulness and obedience to God? Obedience to the guidance we receive from God leads to more guidance from Him. Social position or previous experience is of little importance when God chooses to use you. Parenting with integrity and walking in humbleness with our God are the most important 'qualifications' we can have throughout all of the parenting stages. This Christmas may the life of Joseph inspire and encourage you. God still longs to reveal Himself. He still desires to give parents guidance. He still wants us to grow in dependence and trust in Him. There is nothing to fear when we walk with Him."

May the Lord bless and keep you now and throughout the coming year.




