#### March On

I was in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade when Troy schools began a band program. As one can imagine, those early days at band practice produced some squeaky and eerie sounds coming out of the various instruments we were learning to play. However, as time went on, the sound coming from those instruments got better and better. We began to have concerts. Then, on one fall day on a Friday night, we lined up on the goal line of the football field and marched onto the field. That initial march onto the field was a highlight in the history of Troy schools. Never before had the school had a band, much less one that marched onto the field and performed at halftime. That initial march on the field was just the beginning of many more to follow, with more complexity, more variety, and a more accomplished sound as time went on. Quite simply, the more we marched, the better we got at what we were doing.

Isn't that generally true in any task? The more practice we put into something the better we get at it. I'm not going to go so far as to say, "Practice makes perfect." After all, even the most accomplished performer will have a trip up every now and then. But, in general, the theory holds true, even extending into the practice of living out our faith. When we follow God and His Word, tasks that may seem difficult or even insurmountable at first glance get accomplished. We just need to march on.

When I think about marching on with God, I think of the task Joshua faced when the people of Israel had entered the Promised Land following the Exodus out of Egypt. The Lord had given the command to conquer Jericho. Jericho was fortified with strong walls to protect it. The task was daunting and seemed insurmountable. Yet, the Lord gave Joshua the simple command to march on. The Lord's exact words are recorded, as follows:

You shall march around the city, all the men of war going around the city once. Thus shall you do for six days. Seven priests shall bear seven trumpets of rams' horns before the ark. On the seventh day you shall march around the city seven times, and the priests shall blow the trumpets. And when they make a long blast with the ram's horn, when you hear the sound of the trumpet, then all the people shall shout with a great shout, and the wall of the city will fall down flat, and the people shall go up, everyone straight before him." (Joshua 6:3-5, ESV)

### Jesus In The Psalms - Psalm 19 (NLT)

I have often said (and preached more than once) that I LOVE the law. I love knowing that Jimmy is not supposed to cut in front of me in line. I love knowing that the person who spoke wrongly about me is in the wrong. I cheer when the person who sped past me on I-35 as I was going the speed limit is pulled over just a mile or two later. I am not alone, we all love justice. We love when someone gets their due! We all want to “Stick It To The Man,” so to speak.

And while I might not like it when the law tells me I was the one who cut in line (7th Commandment), or I was the one who spoke wrongly about someone else (8th Commandment), or that I was the one who sped (4th Commandment and 5th Commandment), the Psalms tells us this is actually a good thing for us!

Because without the law, “How can I know all the sins lurking in my heart?” (v. 12a)

To be honest, I can't. So I pray, “Cleanse me from these hidden faults.” (v. 12b)

God not only hears that prayer, He answers it with His Law - to which David says:

<sup>7</sup>The instructions of the Lord are perfect, reviving the soul. The decrees of the Lord are trustworthy, making wise the simple.

<sup>8</sup>The commandments of the Lord are right, bringing joy to the heart. The commands of the Lord are clear, giving insight for living.

<sup>9</sup>Reverence for the Lord is pure, lasting forever. The laws of the Lord are true; each one is fair.

<sup>10</sup>They are more desirable than gold, even the finest gold. They are sweeter than honey, even honey dripping from the comb.

We usually place Law and Gospel at odds with each other. Because of the Law, I need the Gospel. The Law begins to look like the bad guy! Since it comes from God though, it is just as holy and good as the Gospel. Instructions revive the soul. Decrees make wise the simple. Commandments bring joy. Commands give insight. Reverence lasts forever. The laws are fair. They are more desirable than all the things of this world!

Perhaps the biggest reason why the Law is benefiting to me is that it shows me my sinful state but doesn't leave me there. The law leads and guides me - and when I do slip up... when I have an ill thought, or find myself over the speed-limit, or find myself struggling with the thorn in my flesh, I know that the Law-giver is also the Law-Fulfiller.

When Jesus was in the wilderness for 40 days He was not just tempted the three times that are specifically spoken about. Luke 4:13 says, “And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed until an opportune time.” Jesus experienced every temptation to sin the devil could throw at Him, and He resisted every single one. This, along with His passion, death, resurrection and ascension are all how He fulfills the Law in my stead.

Now, instead of fear condemnation and judgement for my mistakes, I know I can repent and confess, receive forgiveness, and pray to God,

“May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be pleasing to you, O LORD, my rock and my redeemer!” (v. 14)

### Tuberculosis: An Little Thought of Disease

Tuberculosis (TB) has been around for thousands of years. It was studied in England and France in the early 1700's, and finally in late 1800's there was a medication to help fight the deadly disease. It is a potentially serious infectious disease in the lungs caused by a bacteria called *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* (MT). It is spread from one person to another through tiny droplets released into the air via coughing, sneezing, speaking, spitting, laughing, or singing. There was a vaccine developed in the early 1900's. Then in the mid-1980's there was a resurgence of the disease due to the emergence of the HIV virus. But by the early 1990's it was back under some control according to the Center for Disease Control (CDC). According to the CDC, there still is a concern for the disease reemerging.

There are to different types of TB. Latent TB is having the bacteria in your body but not infectious (in an inactive state). Active TB is the bacteria that is actually making you sick and is very contagious. Symptoms include: coughing that lasts three or more weeks, coughing up blood, chest pain or pain with breathing or coughing, unintentional weight loss, fatigue, fever, drenching night sweats, chills, and loss of appetite. TB may spread to other parts of the body, i.e., kidneys, spine, or brain. A person is at an increased risk of TB if people: have a weakened immune system or autoimmune disease; have HIV/AIDS; use IV drugs; are in contact with active TB people; are from a Latin American, African, or Asian country; live or work in communal areas, i.e. prisons or nursing homes; work in the health care industry; are children or the elderly.

Everyone should be vaccinated for TB. If you are one of those people who are susceptible and/or work in the above mentioned jobs, most employers require TB skin tests annually. Treatment is with special antibiotics for a long period of time (6-9 months). Treatment is a complicated and lengthy process. If you and/or your family have been exposed, you need to be tested. Then prevention is the best policy. Stay at home, ventilate the room, cover your mouth, and wear a mask until you have been confirmed healthy.

There is much more I could say about TB, but there is not room in this article. For further information the Mayo Clinic has good information. [Researchgate.net](https://www.researchgate.net) also has an in-depth article on the subject. This is one of those diseases that, if not in the current news cycle, one tends to forget about it. It is a real concern now that there has been such an influx of illegal immigrants from Latin and South America.

This topic has always had special meaning to me, as my maternal grandmother died in 1919 at the age of about 42 from active TB. She was placed in a Sanitarium back in those days to prevent the spread to her family. My maternal grandfather even built her a tiny one room house so she could come home and see her family through small windows. My mother (age 2 ½) could only see her mother through those windows and had no physical contact.


### 2020 Easter Mini-Cantata


