In a store or a fast food establishment, one will occasionally see an employee with a badge that reads, "Management Trainee." This badge establishes the fact that this person is in a special program to learn how to become a manager for the business that is training him or her. This designation is generally seen as a special position and one that has a promising future when the person has gained the knowledge and learned the skills to be a manager someday.

Luke 12:48b - Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required, and from him to whom they entrusted much, they will demand the more. (ESV)

He teaches us to be faithful with what He gives –

1 Corinthians 4:2 - Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful. (ESV)

He teaches us to be cheerful in giving back to Him –

2 Corinthians 9:7 - Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. (ESV)

He teaches to use what He gives us to serve others –


1 Peter 4:10 - As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: (ESV)

Jesus in the Psalms - Psalm 15 (NLT)

¹Who may worship in your sanctuary, Lord? Who may enter your presence on your holy hill? ²Those who lead blameless lives and do what is right, speaking the truth from sincere hearts. ³Those who refuse to gossip or harm their neighbors or speak evil of their friends. ⁴Those who despise flagrant sinners, and honor the faithful followers of the Lord, and keep their promises even when it hurts. ⁵Those who lend money without charging interest, and who cannot be bribed to lie about the innocent. Such people will stand firm forever.

This past summer my family and I visited friends in Annapolis, Maryland, home of the Naval Academy. They took us to the Academy right before lunch so we could experience something unique that you don't always see: Noon Formation.

Everyday before lunch the brigade of more than 4,000 midshipmen attending the Academy march in their battalions and assemble in the square outside of the cafeteria. Originally, it was to account for all of the midshipmen - their leaders will still call out when asked "All present and accounted for." The tradition has become more about pageantry over the course of time, but nonetheless, if you are going to eat lunch, you better be in uniform, on time and marching.

There are a whole lot that of requirements in order to be able to participate in lunch (and that's not even taking into consideration all of the standards you have to meet in order to even be considered to join the Academy).

Have you ever had to do that many things in order to participate in an activity? Have you ever considered what God might expect of you as you prepare/plan for attending worship?

"Who may worship in your sanctuary, Lord?" David asks in Psalm 15:1. He answers with a list of regulations that might be one of the few to put Noon Formation to shame. Go back and reread the Psalm, this time keeping track on one hand the number of requirements you have kept perfectly. If you have any fingers left up after that exercise we should have conversation about the definition of "perfect." So then, if we can't keep these perfectly, how can anyone worship in the house of the Lord?

In John 4, as Jesus is speaking to the Samaritan woman at the well, she mentions some of the regulations that were necessary to have worship - mainly that it occurred in Jerusalem, His "holy hill."

Jesus gently rebukes her and shares that the time was coming when that regulation was not going to be necessary for worship. Instead of a specific location (and along with it all of the regulations David shares in Psalm 15), those who are "true worshipers will worship in spirit and truth" (John 4:23-24).

So what does that mean for us today? Who may enter the sanctuary of the Lord in 2019 to worship? The rhetorical answer is obviously anyone and everyone. That being said there are still many who have been deceived into thinking differently.

- They include members of St. Paul who have been absent for a long period of time, who think they need to accomplish a certain number of things in their life before they can come back.
- They include those who are outside of our church looking in, who think that before they can worship they need to fully understand and ascribe to all of our traditions and customs and our way of life.
- Then there are others who think there is some aspect of their life that is preventing Jesus from loving them, and if Jesus can't love them how in the world could the church even begin to try?

Jesus comes to each of those people who think they don't meet the requirements as they are and says, "Come and worship in spirit and truth!" You see, Jesus doesn't accept us as we are - He meets us where we are, and starts to show us the way.

He is continuing to do that for you - because you still don't meet all the requirements. And as He does this for you, He calls you to walk alongside the person in your life who doesn't meet all the requirements - and help them learn, too, so that at the last day when all believers are worshiping Christ in person they will be able to hear, "All Present and Accounted For!"

Breast Cancer Awareness Month

October is known for National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Time to “think pink.” Breast cancer can be a woman’s worst nightmare. But early prevention is the name of the game. That is why mammograms are so vital for a woman’s health regimen. Breast cancer is generally located in one of three areas. It can be, most commonly, in the ducts, in the lobes (where the milk is produced), and in the soft tissues and lymph nodes. It is usually noticed by a lump or a hard spot in the breast tissue.

A woman’s risk factors are many, but does not mean that she will ever develop the disease. These include: alcohol use, being overweight, not being physically active, barrenness, not breastfeeding, birth control use, hormone therapy before and after menopause, and breast implants. The American Cancer Society (ACS) respectively recommends the following: no more than one drink of alcohol daily (no more than 12 oz. of beer, 5 oz. wine, or 1.5 oz. of hard liquor), maintain a healthy body weight for your height, being moderately active for 2.5 hours per week or vigorously active 1.6 hours per week, having a child before age 30, breastfeeding for 1.5 to 2 years, not using birth control medications or devices of any kind, not using hormone replacement therapy before or after menopause, and not having breast implants (especially silicone or textured ones).

Other risk factors that women cannot change: being female, aging, inherited genes, family history of the disease, personal history of the disease, your race and ethnicity, having dense breast tissue, other breast conditions, history of menses, menopause after age 55, having radiation to the chest, exposure to diethylstilbestrol (a miscarriage prevention drug used in the 1940s through the early 1970’s. The ACS says other environmental factors are unclear to the risks such as: diet, vitamins, chemicals in the environment, tobacco use, and night shift work.

There is much discussion about taking some medications to help breast cancer risk. These medications include Tamoxifen and Raloxifene (chemoprevention). The side effects are the concern and may outweigh the use of these medications.

Finding breast cancer through early detection and starting with the best treatment are the most important strategies to prevent deaths from breast cancer. Mammography is the screening tool used to detect cancer cells in the breast. For women, with an average risk, aged 40-44 should have one annually, aged 45-54 annually, and women aged 55 and older every other year. High risk women should have one starting at age 30 annually. There are other methods used for detection; but the mammogram is generally completed first. Other methods of detection include: ultrasound, MRI, 3D imaging, optical imaging test, molecular imaging, positron emission, electrical impedance, and Elastography. Doctors may do needle biopsies, surgical, and lymph node biopsy.

I know that I have only grazed the surface of this subject. There is much more detailed information on the ACS website. And men don’t think you’ve gotten off easy this month, because breast cancer can affect you also. But women have a 100% greater chance of breast cancer than you do.

May the Lord of Mercy protect us from all adversity.

WASHINGTON ON THE BRAZOS

Please join us for this special day-trip on Friday, October 4! Located on 293 acres of lush park land, the picturesque Washington on the Brazos State Historic Site gives visitors unique insights into the lives and times of the 59 delegates who met on that very spot on March 2, 1836 to make a formal declaration of independence from Mexico. From 1836 to 1846, the Republic of Texas proudly but precariously existed as a separate and unique nation. Washington on the Brazos is, indeed, "Where Texas Became Texas."

Washington on the Brazos State Historic Site has many onsite attractions open daily, as well as an incredible year-round schedule of events and programs. On the grounds of this TPWD-run state park is the Star of the Republic Museum (administered by Blinn College); Independence Hall; and Barrington Living History Farm. The site's Visitor Center features interactive exhibits which present a timeline of the Texas Revolution; it also houses the spacious Washington Emporium Gift Shop, which offers snacks and a wide range of Texas-themed items.

We will depart from the church at 7:30 a.m., cost will be \$15 per person for transportation and entry, plus lunch at your own expense at "Must Be Heaven" Sandwich Shop in Brenham. 
